## Tools and the Man

by Dr. W. B. WRIGHT, late of H.M. Geological Survey

Dr. W. B. Wright, author of *THE QUATERNARY ICE AGE*, which is now in its second edition, has come to the conclusion that the sciences of Archaeology and Geology are inextricably interwoven and mutually illuminating. He has consequently made a study of the recent work on Archaeology and discusses its bearing upon the Ice Ages. The present work is an attempt to give all that is important in modern Stone-age typology, both in its evolutionary aspect and in its relation to geological events. The years just past have witnessed many remarkable advances in the study of stone implements, and important discoveries have been made regarding their relation to geological deposits. The literature is difficult of access, whether to serious students or to the general public who are interested in the origin of the human race, and there is a real need for a book which presents in a compact and readable form the essentials of what is known on the subject. *TOOLS AND THE MAN* is an attempt to fill the gap. Above all, it aims at being a reliable guide to recent work on the Stone Age and to what is known rather than imagined regarding early man.
