*Cover. Bronze bracelet and spiral object discovered at a dried-out lake near Papowo Biskupie in north-central Poland. In 2023, metal detecting identified substantial numbers of bronze finds; subsequent excavations revealed several metalwork deposits and dozens of human skeletons dated to between 1000 and 400 BC. Over 550 bronze artefacts have been recovered from the site, comprising predominantly arm and neck ornaments and other types of objects commonly associated with female burials, as well as horse-related gear, typical of the Halstatt period.
