

Henry Dan Piper, editor of the volume, says in his introduction that he gathered Cowley's prose because he felt there was a need for a source book of college readings in the era (why then the \$10 price?). The dedication reads: "For the Class of 1967." Not surprisingly the writers of the thirties have become the heroes of the students of the sixties, just as those of the twenties were glorified by the "silent generation" of the fifties. Finally Cowley shows one how to act like an intellectual in a time like our own; how to invest liberalism with moral courage together with a "hatred" — to quote George Orwell — of "all the smelly little orthodoxies which are now contending for our souls." This above all must the Class of 1967 learn.
