### The Spirituality of the Old Low Countries

Stephanus Axters, O.P.

This little book is a translation of five lectures given in 1946 in Paris on the spiritual writers of that part of northern Europe which used to be called the Low Countries. When one thinks of names such as Ruysbroeck, Thomas à Kempis and Blosius one detects a unity more than geographical and a universality which gives the whole world a claim on them. Their influence has been immense. Spiritual writers are those who treat of the life of union with God by grace and friendship. Father Axters is the scholar and historian and his appeal will be to the learned, but also, to the many who aspire to lead the spiritual life by striving to do God's will and to practise the Christian virtues which shone forth in Our Lord.
