Towards self-reliance: Development, employment and equity issues in Tanzania

The Tanzanian economy has made commendable progress over the past decade. Yet while open unemployment in urban areas is not as severe as in other African countries, it does nevertheless exist and has defied some of the ad hoc measures taken to counter it. Income disparities have been considerably reduced but inequalities do still persist and poverty continues to be a major concern. This is the report of the JASPA mission which was invited by the Government to study the country's employment and unemployment problems and to suggest measures for solving them.

Narrowing the gaps: Planning for basic needs and productive employment in Zambia

The employment advisory mission that visited Zambia in 1975 came to the conclusion that the most serious problem facing Zambia was the poverty of the mass of the people rather than of those who are conventionally classified as unemployed. The mission recommended that a new strategy for meeting the basic needs of the poorest sections of the population through productive employment and provision of essential social services should be adopted by the Government in its future development efforts.

Reducing dependence: A strategy for productive employment and development in Swaziland

An interdisciplinary employment advisory mission to Swaziland in 1976 found that, notwithstanding the impressive economic progress made since independence in 1968, the country's economy is faced with problems that may be classified in four broad categories: dualism, dependence, unemployment and underemployment, and inequality in the distribution of income. As a contribution towards meeting these problems the mission outlined a strategy primarily aimed at the satisfaction of basic needs and the elimination of poverty.

Economic transformation in a socialist framework: An employment and basic needs oriented development strategy for Somalia

In response to a request from the Government of Somalia, an employment advisory mission under the aegis of JASPA examined the various challenges and constraints to the country's rapid economic development. It identified the main employment problems and suggested ways of reorienting economic and social policies so as to enable the objectives of fuller productive employment, reduction of inequalities in income distribution and provision of basic needs to the poorer sections of the population to be achieved in the near future.
