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The African Studies Association was organized in 1957 by a group of specialists on Africa to bring together those with scholarly and research interests in the African continent. The major purposes of the Association are the following:

- TO FACILITATE COMMUNICATION among scholars interested in Africa
 - TO COLLECT AND DISSEMINATE INFORMATION on Africa which is useful to the members
 - TO STIMULATE AND FACILITATE RESEARCH on Africa in ways appropriate to a scholarly organization
 - TO HOLD MEETINGS for the discussion of pertinent topics
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
