

There is no restriction on age or nationality, but no scholar will be permitted to receive the award more than once. The value of the award is expected to be in the region of £1000.

Applications giving full details of the applicant's academic career and research interests, the project for which the grant is sought, and the names of two referees acquainted with the applicant's work, should be submitted to the Secretary, Royal Asiatic Society, 60 Queen's Gardens, London W2 3AF no later than 31st May 1992. The successful applicant will be notified by 1st July 1992, and will be expected to report to the society on the progress of his/her research within 12 months after the receipt of the award.
