### **Columbia University**

The Institute of War and Peace Studies of Columbia University offers three prizes of \$5000 each for the best papers developing practical ideas for dealing with problems of political violence, including civil and international wars, ethnic violence, genocide, and terrorism. The papers should be well grounded in a systematic, empirical analysis of the causes of political violence and should emphasize the practical prescriptions that follow from the analysis. They should be written in a way that makes them accessible to a wide audience. Papers should advance proposals of a *general* nature for mitigating violent conflict. Specific conflicts may be discussed for illustrative purposes, but the principal goal is lasting knowledge that will be broadly applicable, not just proposals for solutions to a particular conflict. We strongly encourage applications from those who are at the early stages of their career, including graduate students, as well as established experts. The papers should not have been published as of the date of submission. Papers should be article length (20-40 double spaced pages) – we will not consider book-length manuscripts. Winning papers will be selected by an interdisciplinary panel of distinguished academic and non-academic judges affiliated with a variety of institutions.


