PURPOSE AND ORGANIZATION

In 1970, four elective area Councils—South Asia, Southeast Asia, China and Inner Asia, and Northeast Asia—were established to guarantee each area constituency its own representation and a proportionate voice on the Board of Directors. In 1977, a Council of Conferences was established as a liaison with eight regional conferences throughout the United States to serve the needs of those interested in Asian studies in different parts of the country. The Association is a member of the American Council of Learned Societies and the National Council of Area Studies Associations, actively participating with its sister societies in a wide range of activities, including joint participation in research and informational exchanges.

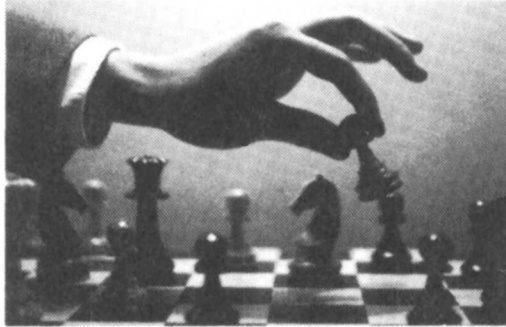
