CONTRIBUTORS

Lyman L. Johnson is Emeritus Professor of History at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. He is a two-time senior Fulbright-Hays lecturer and has received fellowships from the Tinker Foundation, the Social Science Research Council, the National Endowment for the Humanities, and the American Philosophical Society. Johnson's recent books include *Workshop of Revolution: Plebeian Buenos Aires and the Atlantic World, 1776–1810*; *Aftershocks: Earthquakes and Popular Politics in Latin America* (edited with Jürgen Buchenau); *Death, Dismemberment, and Memory: Body Politics in Latin America*; and *The Faces of Honor: Sex, Shame, and Violence in Colonial Latin America* (edited with Sonya Lipsett-Rivera). He has published in many journals, including the *Hispanic American Historical Review*, *The Americas*, the *Journal of Latin American Studies*, and *Desarrollo Económico*. He served as president of the Conference on Latin American History in 1997–98.

Vanessa Freije will join the Dartmouth College Society of Fellows as a postdoctoral fellow and the Henry M. Jackson School of International Studies at the University of Washington as an assistant professor in fall 2015. Her research and writing have been funded by the Fulbright-García Robles Fellowship, the Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies Pre-doctoral Fellowship at the University of California San Diego, and the Duke University Katherine Goodman Stern Fellowship. She received her PhD from Duke University in spring 2015 and is now preparing a book manuscript on political scandals, journalists, and Mexican politics.

Asunción Lavrin is Professor Emerita of History, Arizona State University. She is a corresponding member of the Mexican Academy of History and has published on Mexican colonial history, women's history, the history of feminism in the Southern Cone, sexuality, and women's conventual life. She is currently engaged in research on the mendicant orders in New Spain.

Stephanie Mitchell is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of History at Carthage College in Kenosha, Wisconsin. She co-authored and co-edited *The Women's Revolution in Mexico, 1910–1953* (2006). Her research interests include women, gender, and the Mexican and Guatemalan revolutions. She is currently working on another co-edited volume on suffrage in the Americas.
