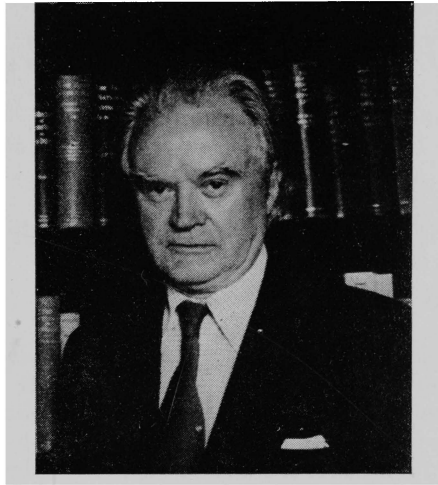

Joint Editor of *Irish Historical Studies*, 1938-77

When *Irish Historical Studies* began publication in 1938 as the only scholarly journal exclusively devoted to the study of Irish history T. W. Moody was one of its two original editors. He continued to act as joint editor of the first twenty volumes, comprising eighty issues, and this is the first number on the title page of which his name does not appear as editor.

The debt owed to Dr. Moody by Irish historical studies in general, and by the journal which he edited for fully forty years in particular, is clearly incalculable. It is therefore especially appropriate that his co-founder and first joint editor of *Irish Historical Studies*, R. Dudley Edwards, has contributed a paper to the present issue which delineates, even if only in outline, the dimensions of that debt.
