Established in 1869, the *International Review of the Red Cross* is a periodical published by the ICRC and Cambridge University Press. A specialized journal in humanitarian law, it endeavours to promote knowledge, critical analysis and development of the law, and contribute to the prevention of violations of rules protecting fundamental rights and values. Established in 1863, the ICRC is at the origin of the International Red Cross and Red Crescent Movement.
