Providing travel assistance for young WPSA members and students to participate in regional and global WPSA Conferences

The Association has funds set aside for a limited number of travel grants. These are to provide international travel assistance for YOUNG WPSA members (both scientists and poultry producers) from developing countries and STUDENTS from developed countries to attend and participate in regional and global WPSA conferences.

Application conditions

- Applications must be submitted at least three months prior to the meeting. If a scientific paper or poster is the basis for the application, this need not have been accepted at the time of application but it will eventually must be formally accepted before funds are disbursed
- Maximum age of the applicant is 40 years at the time of application.
- Applicants must have been a member of WPSA for at least six months at the time of application.
- No member may receive more than two Travel Grants.
- Successful applicants will receive the funds electronically AFTER the meeting on receipt of a copy of the airline ticket.
- Incomplete or late submissions will NOT be considered.

Application form must be accompanied by:

1. Either

A copy of the submitted abstract.

Or

One typed page clearly outlining how you propose to network at the meeting. Describe the feasibility of your plan and what you hope to gain. Possibilities for the plan could include names of individuals you plan to interview or conference attendees you plan to meet who share similar interests to your own. Networking plans must be made in advance and must involve individuals with whom you are not already acquainted.

- Budget request and justification (one page). You must include the cost of economy rate travel, food and lodging. Conference registration fees and dues will NOT be funded.
- Letter of recommendation from a wellknown member of your WPSA Branch stating why you are a worthy candidate to receive a Travel Grant.
- 4. Short Curriculum Vitae and photo.

WPSA Speakers Bureau Fostering local and regional conferences in the poultry sciences

During the 34th meeting of the Board of WPSA on August 20, 2000 in Montreal, Canada it was recognised that expertise in several areas of poultry science and production in low income countries is often very limited, and WPSA branches in these countries often do not have sufficient financial resources to fund overseas speakers.

To address this problem, the Board created a Speakers' Bureau to assist branches in low income countries to cover the travel costs of expert international speakers. This measure is consistent with the key objective of WPSA to encourage and facilitate liaison among research scientists and educators, and between those in research and education and those working in the many diverse sectors of the poultry industry. Under the Speakers' Bureau scheme, WPSA will pay only the cost of air travel (lowest economy class). All other expenses such as local travel and accommodation are to be paid by the organizing Branch(es). WPSA will not pay any honorarium to speakers.

Given the high cost of international air travel it is important that optimum value be obtained from this expenditure by WPSA. This can be achieved by insisting that the visiting speaker provides more than just one paper at a conference. The visiting speaker could contribute in a variety of ways, e.g., present a second paper on a related topic, conduct a workshop for graduate students, have small group or one-on-one interaction, especially with students, visit industry groups, visit university groups, etc.

Unless the Branch (or group of Branches) can pay all the speakers' costs itself, a speaker should NOT be invited until approval of Speakers' Bureau funds is made by the WPSA Executive Committee. The Branch(es) should not assume that approval will be given until so advised by the WPSA Secretary.

Where a Branch or a group of Branches wish to apply for Speakers Bureau assistance, there are certain conditions which must be met:

Application conditions

Application must be made using the WPSA Speakers' Bureau application form.

Application must be submitted at least 2 months prior to the meeting.

The speaker must contribute more to the meeting and/or branch than just presenting one paper.

Following approval, the speaker or the local Branch will be reimbursed by the WPSA Treasurer after the meeting.

A maximum of 2 speakers will be sponsored from the Speakers' Bureau per meeting. The Branch(es) must be up-to-date with their membership payment.

Foundation for Promoting Poultry Science Stichting Bevordering Pluimveewetenschappen

The XIX World's Poultry Congress, held in September 1992 in Amsterdam, was financially successful. This outcome was, to a large extent, due to the contributions received from the 16 main sponsors and over 2500 participants. The terms of reference of the Congress Organizing Foundation required that any credit balance that resulted after all liabilities had been met should be made available to the Dutch Branch of WPSA as initiator of the organization of the Congress. As a result, a Foundation for Promoting Poultry Science (Stichting Bevordering Pluimveewetenschappen) was founded. The general objective of this foundation are "to promote the developments and propagation of poultry science in WPSA-structures, and specifically:

- the stimulation of international congresses and the promotion of participation in these events, and
- the support of initiative having the objective of establishing WPSA-branches in countries which do not yet have them".

Individuals and organizations may apply for financial support for appropriate WPSA activities such as conferences, congresses and symposia. Applications for financial support of conferences, congresses and symposia should be forwarded through the local WPSA Branch.

The Foundation has a particular interest in assisting in the process of establishing new WPSA branches and therefore supports these branches by covering for three years part of the membership fees. An application form will be send on request.

The Board of directors of the Foundation meets three or four times a year. In case of requests for financial assistance to attend conferences, congresses and symposia, applications should be received by the secretary at least 3 months before the meeting.

Application forms should be filled out completely and can be send through e-mail and fax. An original application form should be send by regular mail.

It is the Boards policy not to fund individual applicants more than 2 times.

Germany

The German Branch has a tradition of holding its annual meetings in March as a two-day event, with a board meeting preceding the general assembly, dinner on the first day, a scientific programme and excursions on the second day. This year, the meeting was held in the historic Hapag Hall in Cuxhaven and attracted a total of 150 members and guests.

The meeting was opened by Prof. Flock, President of the German Branch, with a brief review of activities during the 10 years since the European Poultry Conference in Bremen, after which he served four years as President of the European Federation and nine years as President of the German Branch. During this time, annual meetings were held at different locations across the country, and active participation in World Congresses, European Conferences and Symposia of WPSA Working Groups was regularly supported by travel grants.

Highlights in 2011 were the Turkey Symposium in Berlin, the Egg/Meat Symposium in Leipzig and an excursion to Northern Italy.

The assembly approved unanimously the changes proposed by the Board for the next 3-year term: Prof. Werner Bessei succeeds Prof. Flock as President, Dr. Anke Förster and Dr. Peter Behr continue as Secretary and Vice President, respectively. Four new members will rejuvenate the Board: Leo Graf Drechsel, President of the German Poultry Association; Prof. Robby Andersson, University of Osnabrück; Ingrid Simon, Münster; and Dr. Inga Tiemann, Düsseldorf.

Prof. Heinz Pingel, Secretary of the GDR Branch from 1970 until German reunification in 1990 and internationally known for his research on waterfowl, was recognized with honorary membership. Appreciation on behalf of the German Branch was expressed by Vice President Dr. Behr for the contributions of Prof. Flock to WPSA activities at the national and international level.

Current activities focus on preparations for the WPC2012 in Salvador, Brazil, and the German Branch again will support young scientists with travel grants.

The German Branch had submitted a bid to host the WPC2020, and details were being prepared for the site inspection in Berlin following the branch meeting. To get the latest information on plans for the World

Israel

The 47th Annual Meeting and Convention of the Israeli branch was held in Jerusalem for three days in March, 2012. The convention consisted of 14 sessions which covered disciplines including poultry disease and prevention; poultry physiology; incubation; poultry nutrition; water quality in the poultry industry; special issues regarding lying hens; special issues regarding broilers; and special round tables focusing on updated issues which concern the poultry industry in Israel.

During 2011 two members of the WPSA Israeli Branch passed away: Prof. Israel Nir and Dr. Yehuda Zamberg, both had made outstanding contributions to the Israeli Branch as well as to the WPSA. The 47 annual meeting included special scientific sessions in memory of Professor Nir and Dr. Zamberg.

The annual convention was honoured to invite two overseas scientists: Dr. Michael Hess from the University of Veterinary Medicine, Vienna, who gave a lecture on 'Salmonella and Campylobacter – the main source for food contamination'; and Dr. Mario Penz from the Provimi America, Latina, Brazil who gave a lecture on: 'Future challenges in the poultry industry.'

During the convention 35 companies presented their unique developed items. The number of participants approximated 800, including farmers, members of several commercial companies, members of the extension service, and scientists.

The evenings were intended for guided tours in Jerusalem.

During the year 2012. the branch plans to have 3 separate symposia on different topics.

Sri Lanka

The Sri Lankan Poultry Industry has shown a positive growth trend during recent years. Even though the country is presently self sufficient in poultry products, both for chicken meat and eggs, the current purchasing power of Sri Lankans allows a greater possibility for further expansion of the poultry industry. In the five year Poultry Development Plan recently approved by the Sri Lankan government, promotion for increased consumption of chicken meat and eggs has been identified as one of the main strategies for further development and sustenance of the industry.

The Sri Lanka Branch of WPSA has identified the need to step up the promotion of 'Eggs & Chicken' to Sri Lankan consumers by promoting awareness regarding the nutritive values of poultry products. This timely issue was discussed at several forums and it was decided to start a campaign to bring the benefit of the industry's nutritious products at low cost to Sri Lankan consumers.

According to the activities identified we have prepared the following programme.

- Audio visual programme A documentary film is being done focused on nutritive values and the health benefits of the 'Eggs & Chicken'. Our aim is to distribute this documentary and play it at public gatherings and training forums including those for schools, hospitals, maternity clinics, etc.
- Certain parts of this video will be extracted for advertisements in TV and Radio. This activity will be done in liaison with the National Nutritional Council and The Dept. of Animal Production and Health.
- Posters to popularize the consumption of chicken. This activity is also being done with the Dept. of Animal Production & Health. Distribution of these posters island wide will be done through government and private channels.
- Organize programmes to train farmers on productivity and hygienic production of chicken and eggs.
- Participate in the mid day meal programme

of the Sri Lankan Education Department, in order to introduce school children to the nutritive value of eggs and chicken so that they will take the message home. We will also be facilitating the provision of two eggs per week for the mid day meal programme where the Education Dept. has identified the need to give 2 million eggs per week for the primary school children in selected schools.

 Participate in the programmes of NGOO such as UNICEF where they are trying to reduce the protein malnutrition among infants, children and pregnant mothers.

Our aim in this programme is to provide awareness of the contribution that eggs and chicken can make toward meeting the nutritional requirements of human beings. Through the above programmes, the public will be able to understand the importance of including chicken and eggs in the daily diet of people, and especially the diets of infants and older children in order to prevent malnutrition. We are also planning to address some current myths that exist in the Sri Lankan society that work against the consumption of eggs and chicken. This activity will be one the first steps made for the campaign to increase the consumption of eggs and chicken, and will definitely benefit all stakeholders in the poultry industry.

Turkey

Prof. Dr. Rüveyde Akbay was invited by the WPSA Kuwait branch on 12-16 February 2012 to be an advisor to the country regarding presenting a paper on the topic of 'The Important Role of Research in Advancing the Poultry Industry.' She had several meetings with her Kuwaiti colleagues and during one of these meetings it was decided that an international conference will be jointly organized by the two branches on the subject of developing the poultry sector in Middle Eastern and African countries from 21-25 October 2013 in Antalya. To review the details of the meeting, the organizing committee and scientific committee members from the Kuwait branch were invited to Turkey for a meeting in October this year. Together we will finalise the programme details and the 1st announcement of the conference will be posted on our website.

The 3rd Mediterranean Summit of WPSA convened in Alexandria, Egypt on 26-29 March 2012. In addition to the Chairman of the Mediterranean Poultry Network (MPN) of WPSA Prof. Dr. Servet Yalçın, Advisory Committee member Prof. Dr. Rüveyde Akbay and other members of the Turkish branch participated in this meeting where they gave presentations and were involved in various tasks such as chairing sessions.

The 5th PHABESAS Animal Nutrition and Animal Health Symposium will be organized in Antalya between 8-11 November 2012 by Farmavet, a distinguished company in the sector.

The National Poultry Congress will be held in Izmir between 3-5 October 2012, in cooperation with the Aegean University Faculty of Agriculture. Colleagues from the Kuwait branch will also be attending this congress.
