Annual Conference

The 2008 SCOLMA annual conference, "On the Brink? Endangered Archives and Endangered Languages in Africa" was held at The British Library Conference Centre on 10 June. The day had provided an opportunity to hear more about projects in the Endangered Archives Programme and the Endangered Languages Academic Programme. Subjects included trade unions in Sudan, a photographic studio in Cameroon, and a case study of Bainouk languages.
