### Report of the Treasurer

Professor James L. Sundquist, for the Council, presented the following proposed dues schedule for consideration of the Meeting, and pointed out that the dues schedule could not go into effect unless approved by a referendum vote of the members.

President Miller turned the Meeting over to President-Elect Lindblom. President-Elect Lindblom adjourned the meeting at 5:25 p.m.

Following the Meeting, a mail ballot was sent to all members of the Association. The proposed Constitutional Amendment was approved by a vote of 2,476 for, 497 opposed, and the proposed dues schedule was approved by a vote of 1,572 for, 1,257 opposed.
