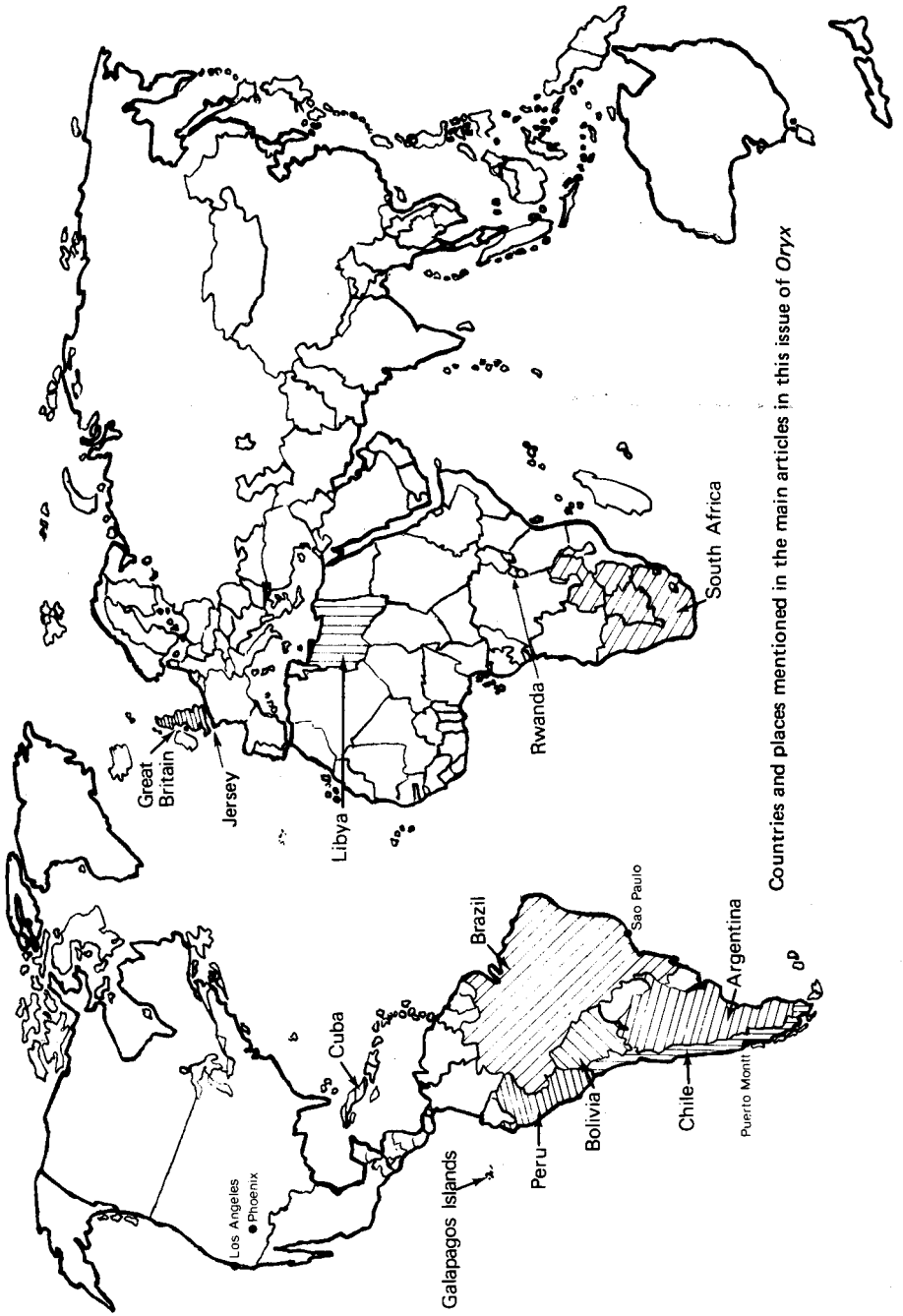
ZAMBIA AND BOTSWANA TOUR
