Membership in the association is open to persons who are professionally interested in the modern languages and literatures. Annual (calendaryear) dues, which include subscription to PMLA, are based on members' incomes and are graduated as follows: student members (seven years maximum), \$20; new regular members (first year), \$35; regular members (income under \$15,000), \$25; regular members (income \$15,000-\$20,000), \$40; regular members (income \$20,000-\$30,000), \$55; regular members (income \$30,000-\$40,000), \$65; regular members (income \$40,000-\$50,000), \$75; regular members (income \$50,000-\$60,000), \$15; regular members (income \$60,000-\$70,000), \$15; regular members (income \$80,000-\$100,000), \$15; regular members (income \$80,000-\$100,000), \$15; regular members (income over \$140,000), \$15; regular members (income \$15,000), \$15; regular members

For libraries and other institutions, an electronic and print subscription for 2008 is \$180, and it includes the electronic and print editions of *Profession*, the MLA's annual journal of opinion about the modern language profession. An institutional subscription including a bound volume at the end of the year is \$350, domestic and foreign. Agents deduct four percent as their fee. Claims for undelivered issues will be honored if they are received within six months of the publication date; thereafter the single-issue price will be charged.
