FPS MEETINGS

On Thursday, January 20, 1966, some of the new African films in the FPS Film Library will be shown at a meeting in the new meeting room of the Zoological Society of London, at 5.30 p.m. These will be "South Africa's Animal Kingdom", "The African Lion", "A Million Flamingos", and "Return to the Wild". The last, about Norman Carr and his lions, was shown at the October meeting, and is being repeated in response to several requests. This copy is on loan to the library from David Shepherd.

On Tuesday, March 15, at 5.30 p.m. in the Zoo meeting room, Dr J. Morton Boyd will speak on "Research and Management in East African Wildlife". Dr Morton Boyd has recently spent nine months in East Africa studying especially the impact of research on the vital and urgent problems of wildlife management. This is an important meeting for the Society, and we hope that many members will be able to come.

FPS TOURS

The FPS East African tour leaves on January 29. The response to this tour was so great that the Society is planning further tours, including another to East Africa in January 1967, and a European one, in response to requests for a less expensive tour, to Texel, in Holland, and the Swiss National Park, in June 1966. Details will be circulated to members early in January.

FPS MEMBERSHIP

In 1965, up to the end of November, the Society enrolled over 300 new members. This is a most encouraging total, and we should like to urge members to do all they can to enrol more in the New Year.
