A biologist looks at problems of population and the environment

Alan S. Parkes

In this book, the distinguished biologist Professor Sir Alan Parkes, CBE, ScD, FRS, takes a unique perspective on the human problems of our time. Refusing to build a wall of professional jargon around population issues, he prefers to simplify and relate them to a wide range of global events that threaten the future of the earth and its people.

After four chapters on the essential elements of demography, he identifies a catalogue of disasters from which it is remarkable that so many have survived, and describes the degradation of the natural environment as a consequence of man's increasing numbers and technology. There is always a BACKLASH, not least, the backlash of sophistication as we foul our nest and our air and add man-made disasters to the natural hazards that affect human numbers.

Sir Alan Parkes died in July 1990 after a long and distinguished career, having continued to the very last to work on this book which he wished to be published after his death.
