THE WILLIAM AND HARRIET GOULD FOUNDATION

The above Foundation announces the recipient of the 1966 Gould Award: Dr. Anders Martensson of Stockholm, Sweden. Dr. Martensson was honoured for his neuro-physiologic investigations of the larynx.

The Gould Award is presented annually for outstanding fundamental contributions in the field of laryngology. The recipient is selected by an international committee which at present consists of Professor Dr. Carl-Axel Hamberger, Karolinska Sjukhuset, Stockholm 60, Sweden; Dr. Jo Ono, 75 Zaimokucho Azabu, Minato-ku, Tokyo, Japan; Dr. Renato Segre, Rodriguez Pena 1875, Buenos Aires, Argentina; and Dr. Hans von Leden, Institute of Laryngology and Voice Disorders, Los Angeles, 25, California, Chairman.

The Award consists of an illuminated plaque and a cash prize. Nominations for the 1967 award should be filed with one of the committee members as soon as possible.

IXTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF AUDIOLOGY

The next (IX) International Congress of Audiology will be held at the Royal College of Surgeons in London from 15–19 September 1968. The President of the Congress will be Air Vice-Marshal E. D. D. Dickson, C.B., C.B.E.

The morning of 16 September will be devoted to a session on the SURGERY OF DEAFNESS under the chairmanship of the President of the British Association of Otolaryngologists. On each of the three subsequent mornings, there will be a round table conference. These three round table conferences will be:—

- I. THE PSYCHO-PHYSIOLOGICAL MATURATION OF THE AUDITORY SENSATION (Moderator: P. Mounier-Kuhn).
- II. PRESBYACUSIS (Moderator: H. A. E. van Dishoeck).
- III. SOCIAL ADJUSTMENT OF DEAF SCHOOL LEAVERS (Moderator: M. Reed).

The afternoons will be devoted to contributed papers and discussions. Those who wish to have a paper considered for presentation at the Congress should send a 600 word summary, which should be factual and not merely topical, to the Secretary-General, Dr. R. Hinchcliffe, 330, Gray's Inn Road, London W.C.1. as soon as possible. A special Committee will make a selection of contributed communications for the scientific programme.
