- £500** to the Charles Darwin Foundation to continue studies on the impact of tourism on the wildlife of the Galapagos Islands;
 - £425** to J. Furtado for analysis of data on the leathery turtle in Malaysia;
 - £350** to Catherine Homewood to continue studies of the endangered Tana mangabey. (See *Oryx* XII, 5, page 565.)
 - £350** to the International Council for Bird Preservation to continue studies on the marine turtles of Cousin Island in the Seychelles;
 - £250** to Anthony Whitten for study of the ecology of Kloss's gibbon *Hylobates klossii* Siberut Island, Indonesia;
 - £210** to George Frame to continue studies on the African hunting dog and cheetah in Tanzania;
 - £100** to R. C. Malpas to contribute to a symposium on elephants in Uganda;
 - £100** to Alison Field towards a gazelle survey in the arid lands of Kenya;
 - £50** to Aberdeen University's expedition to Crete to study Eleanora's falcon.
