The Editors of the *American Political Science Review* would like to alert readers that the article “The Tragedy of the *Nomenklatura*: Career Incentives and Political Radicalism during China's Great Leap Famine” may contain errors, including inaccurate reporting of model specifications for some estimates in Tables 4 and 5 and incorrect compilation or calculation of indicators, that make the core findings unreliable. At the time of publication, *APSR* editorial policies did not require data sharing in a public repository, and according to the authors, the original data are unavailable. The nature of the errors and reliability of the findings are examined and discussed further in:
