

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Sir:

I wish to express my indignation over the manner in which the Review arranged publication of the Symposium on Methodology (XIII, 1, April 1970). The Editor notes that papers originally read at the Annual Meeting in Montreal were published with "some slight editorial changes" (p. 61). Clearly this cannot be said with regard to my own contribution to the Symposium; many changes were made without my knowledge or consent. They include (1) reorganization of paragraphs and deletion of key words and sentences (e.g., p. 91, concluding paragraph) and (2) insertion of objectionable phraseology (e.g., p. 87, first sentence).

In order both to avoid a recurrence of this unfortunate incident and to minimize the number of typographical errors, I strongly urge the Review to adopt the familiar practice of providing contributors with page proofs and galleys.

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
