Sibirica considers all aspects of the region - it is broadly based and pan-disciplinary, and draws on contributions from a wide range of subjects, including history, politics, international relations, strategic studies, economics, geography and environmental studies, sociology, ethnography, anthropology, language and literature, and cultural studies.
