David Wiggins

Wykeham Professor of Logic in the University of Oxford. He was previously Professor of Philosophy at Birkbeck College, London. He has written Sameness & Substance, and Needs, Values Truth.

Ton van den Beld

Associate Professor of Moral Philosophy at the University of Utrecht, The Netherlands. A Czech edition of his dissertation on the political and social philosophy of Thomas G. Masaryk will shortly be published in Prague.

Oswald Hanfling

Theodore Redpath
