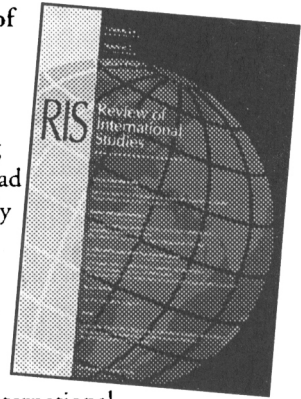

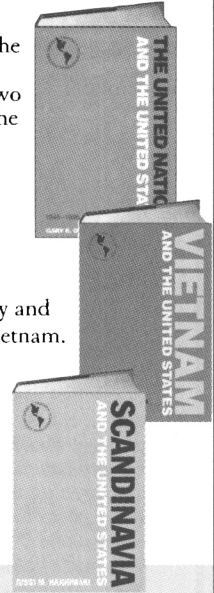

As part of the effort to invest in the next generation of scholars and with financial support from the Ford Foundation, the Academic Council on the UN System has established a competitive awards program for two social scientists or the equivalent for legal scholars. These awards can be used independently or in conjunction with another fellowship. Subsequent to review by an independent selection committee, these awards will be disbursed in July 1999 to cover the period 1 July 1999 - 30 June 2000.

REBUILDING TORN SOCIETIES:

ISSUES OF GOVERNANCE AND INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION

Program

The Academic Council on the United Nations System and the American Society of International Law are jointly sponsoring the ninth in a series of summer workshops on international organization studies to be held at Yale University from 25 July to 6 August 1999. This workshop is designed specifically for advanced graduate students, post-doctoral scholars, and younger faculty.

The purposes of this workshop are to: enhance professional development in international organization studies; encourage new directions in international organization research; establish and strengthen contacts amongst legal and international relations scholars and UN practitioners; and stimulate teaching in international organization studies.

The 1999 workshop will be directed by Linda Reif of the University of Alberta Law School, and Paul Wapner of the American University's School of International Service.

The focus for this workshop is "Rebuilding Torn Societies: Issues of Governance and International Organization." It will serve as a forum for multidisciplinary exchange related to the roles of governance (at local, state, international or NGO levels) and international organization. It will be structured to help stimulate interest and guide: advanced graduate students in the research and writing of

their dissertations; post-doctoral scholars in turning their dissertations into books and articles; and younger faculty members in developing new research agendas. The workshop will consist of presentations made by lecturers and experts in the field, exercises and discussions focusing on developing a greater link between the academic world and the work of practitioners, teaching international organization, and panel presentations made by participants.

The subject matter is open to those whose analytical perspectives are multilateral—to those who are trying to focus on governance and international organization in the complex task of rebuilding torn societies. The United Nations system is crucial in this effort; but key insights result from how non-UN institutions can complement UN ones in a better division of labor.

Application Procedure

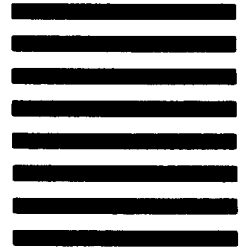

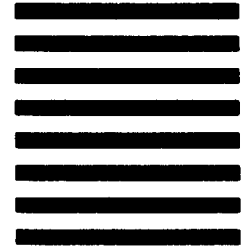
