Administered Chloroform a little after 5 o'clock this morning
to Mrs Cundy 14 Cumberland Terrace Regent Road, on account of
neuralgic pain of the back (situated about the 2^d lumbar vertebra)
on the recommendation of Dr Little of Stratton St. The patient

{283} Wednesday 23 April.

Thursday 30 October 1851
Administered Chloroform at 63 Gloucester Place
Hyde Park to Miss Potifens aged 18 affected with a
large ovarian tumour which had been once or twice
tapped. Mr Baker Brown operated by making an incision
about an inch and a half in length down to the cyst, and
stitching it to the parietes of the abdomen before it was
opened. It was then evacuated of a large quantity of thickish
brown liquid; but some large white tumours were left in the
abdomen. No sickness or other complication.
Patient died about nine days afterwards

{332} Thursday 30 October, 1851.

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Saturday 15 Nov.
Administered Chloroform to Miss Potifca (Age about 25 or 30) at 61
Monmouth Place, whilst Mr. B. Brown removed a fatty tumour from the
Fido. No sickness

{337} Saturday 15 Nov.

Wednesday 4 February 1852
Administered Chloroform to Mr. Giffiths, Bloomsbury Place
whilst Dr. Giffiths removed a very large tumour from the right breast
of an elderly lady named Miss Potter. Mr. Ferguson was present.
The tumour appeared to be very cystic contained large cysts filled
with some parts of sanguinolent fluid. The tumour weighed

{355} Wednesday 4 February, 1852.

Tuesday 27 July
Administered Chloroform at the New Rooms to an elderly
gentleman in a stormy of Norwich whilst Mr. Partridge
operated for strangulated umbilical hernia. The hernia
had been strangulated about four days. The patient was in a state
of great depression, and the intestine was of a very dark colour
from extreme congestion. The patient seemed relieved after the
operation, but he died within 24 hours.

{402} Tuesday 27 July.

Administered Chloroform at 17 Arundel St., Coventry St.
to the wife of Colonel Gower, a lady about 30 whilst Mr. Giffiths
operated on the breast.

{531} Monday 20 February, 1854.

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Monday 2 October
Administered Chloroform at 12 Albert Place, Kensington, to Mr Evans
a Turk about 30 years of age whose Mr Salmon laid open some sinuses
situated near the sacrum. No sickness &c.

{580} Monday 2 October.

Administered Chloroform at Mr Cartwright's to Mr Happy Rogers
whose Mr C. extracted seven teeth and stumps.

{629} Monday 4 June

Administered Chloroform on the 7th or 8th and again to day to Mr Happy Rogers
whose Mr Cartwright extracted seven teeth and stumps on each occasion.
To day Mr C. also lanced the abscess on the side of the face near the angle of
the jaw.

{632} Thursday 14 June.

Wednesday 24 June
Administered Chloroform at 10 St. Helena Street to Mr Birkhoff
about 35 whose Mr Ferguson removed the tonsils which were much enlarged.
The mouth was kept open with the lever, and a fresh dose of Chloroform
was given before the second tonsil was removed. No sickness

{831} Wednesday 24 June.

Administered Chloroform at 13 Cecil Street Strand to Mr Harpelle
about 50 whose Mr Partridge performed circumcision, removing
a very dense and thickened prepuce. A good deal of rigidity for a
minute or two. No sickness

{858} Tuesday 6 October.

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I learned that he had had a similar episode when on occasion of being
to had been administered before my arrival. It seemed that the first
sensation of the chloroform & my strong reaction produced these
severe spasms. Dr. Thomson repeated the chloroform now and then
so as to procure intervals of sleep, but the patient got worse and died
in a last fit of spasms at a quarter past four in the afternoon.
