VISITING SCHOLARS FROM THE MIDDLE EAST

The Middle East Studies Association has received a grant from the Ford Foundation to bring five visiting scholars each year to attend our annual meeting in November and to spend three to six weeks around that date visiting leading Middle East centers and programs in the United States and Canada. Three scholars have accepted MESA's invitation for the fall of 1976. They are:

- 1) Nikita Elisséeff, Professor of Archeology and History, University of Lyon II. Date of visit: October 27 -- November 26.
- 2) Germain Ayache, Professor of History, University of Nice and Mohammed V (Rabat). Date of visit: October 17 -- November 14.
- 3) Hava Lazarus-Yafeh, Professor of Islamic Civilization, The Hebrew University of Jerusalem, Israel. Date of visit: October 24 -- November 14.

A summary of their curriculum vitae is given below. In the spring of 1977, MESA hopes to have as visiting scholar, Mohamed Talbi, Professor of the Faculty of Letters, University of Tunis. He is a specialist in medieval history of Musulmane. Further details about his visit will be published in the winter issue of the Bulletin.
