THE HANDBOOK FOR INCEPTORS AND TRAINEES

DEAR SIR,

My old colleague and friend 'Ezra' has in his inimitable way slightly misunderstood me (*News and Notes*, February, p 6). This was not his fault as the 'Handbook' had not been published at that time.*

Perhaps I should explain something of its genesis, which started with a request from the B.M.A. for information to be included in their Careers Handbook. Each of the Specialist sections and the Group for the Psychiatry of Old Age supplied this, and it was also used at various Career Fairs at Medical Schools around the country. The Education Committee had been considering providing further information for junior trainees in Psychiatry who, before becoming Members of the College, do not receive copies of the Journal or News and Notes, unless they become Inceptors.

It was agreed it would be very useful to let them have information about the College and its activities as well as about examinations and criteria for approval of training, also anything else relevant but not always easily available to a trainee. As a pilot study I tried out an early draft on the trainees at Tooting Bec Hospital, who pointed out that there was nothing in it that could not be acquired in two or three years if one was of an inquiring and diligent temperament, but they regretted that it had not been available to them at the very start of their careers. It was confirmed

that it might be of value to Consultants also when the hospital was visited by an approval team, each of the three leaving with a spare copy. Nevertheless, there are many deficiencies in the Handbook, for example there is an excellent reprint from News and N by Professor Max Hamilton on taking clinical examinations, but there is no equivalent section the Multiple Choice Questionnaire (MCQ) pare For this reason the Education Committee hopes the as many members of the College as possible wa send comments and criticisms and suggestions fa inclusion in a second edition of the Handbook one is called for, and a page is inserted at the end suggest this. It is also hoped that this Handbook w. encourage junior trainees to become Inceptors at th earliest possible moment and take an active part in a the College's activities. A further page at the en is available to enable them to apply to do this, appropriate.

I am glad that 'Ezra' has given me the opportuning to clarify the situation, since it also gives me the chance to thank the many colleagues who have helped in its compilation.
