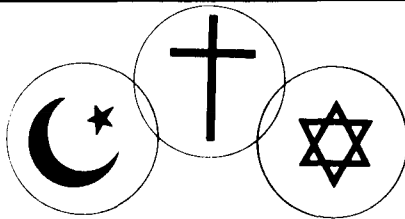

This volume is a meticulous analysis of economic activities and an examination of the system of ownership in Islam. The author, Seyyed Mahmood Taleqani (1911-79), was one of Iran's most respected religio-political personalities, a leading authority on Islamic jurisprudence, and a central figure in the Iranian Revolution. *Islam and Ownership* is one of the few books written that deal exclusively with a topic traditionally subsumed under *feqh* under the heading of *mo'amelat* or business law. The author provides a critical analysis of Western economic ideas, particularly Marxism, regarding ownership of natural resources and property and presents a comprehensive view of ownership based on Islamic principles and precepts.

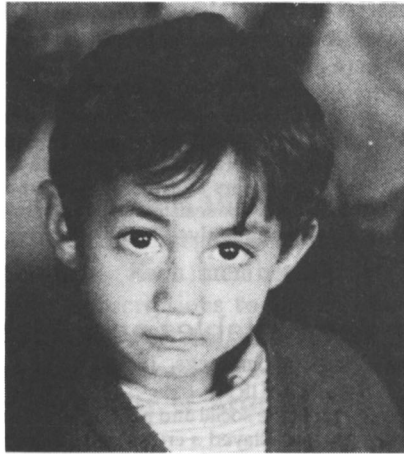
