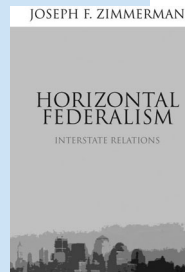

**Joseph F. Zimmerman** is a professor of political science at the University at Albany, State University of New York.

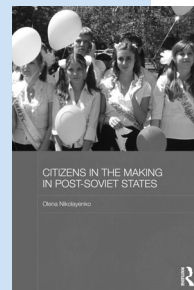
