This volume attempts to list and evaluate all work pertaining to Josephus, directly or indirectly, that has been published during the years 1937 through 1979. It differs from previously published bibliographies of Josephus in four major respects: 1) It is much more exhaustive, listing hundreds of items that have been omitted by other bibliographers and critics; 2) It arranges the subject-matter according to 29 major topics and 428 subtopics, instead of according to year of publication or according to alphabetical order; 3) Above all, it presents not only summaries but, in most cases, criticisms, often at length, of the various items and, for all major problems, an evaluation of the state of the question; 4) It gives a long list of desiderata in the field and the reasons why such works are needed. Because Josephus dealt not only with political and military history but also with religious and cultural issues and because of his importance not only for mainstream Judaism but also for paganism, sectarian Judaism, and Christianity, it presents, in effect, an evaluation of scholarship on the period as a whole.

Main topics are: The text of Josephus; ancient and modern versions; Josephus' life; Josephus' paraphrase of the Bible; Josephus as historian of the post-Biblical period; the war against the Romans; Josephus' sources; Josephus' views on Jewish law; Josephus on Samaritans, Pharisees, Sadducees, Essenes, the Dead Sea Sect; Josephus and Jesus Christianity; Josephus and archaeology; Josephus' style; Josephus' influence; Desiderata.
