## David Glass Memorial Fund

We have been giving consideration to a fitting memorial for Professor David Glass and, after consulting some of his many friends and colleagues, have decided to establish in the first place a series of David Glass Memorial Lectures on Social Trends. The series is intended to illustrate and to carry on a radical approach to scholarship and a wide range of studies, with a rare combination of speculative considerations and solid empirical sustenance, which would be akin to his own. It is hoped to hold the lecture annually at the London School of Economics and to publish the text thereafter in a special series.

In keeping with the many facets of David Glass's life and word, illustrated in Professor Ralf Dahrendorf's obituary, the brief for the Memorial Lectures will by no means be rigid. There will be no geographical or professional restriction in the choice of lecturers or subjects. It is hoped that the lectures will not be highly specialised but broad-based; and that each will provide a rather wide-ranging review—preferably a comparative, cross-national and novel review—of major social phenomena, institutions or trends. Naturally, the subject of Population Studies will have its place in the series.

A Fund has been set up to finance the establishment of the Memorial Lectures with the aim of raising £9,000 for this purpose. We hope that all those who value David Glass's scholarship and wish to honour his name and work will wish to contribute to the Fund.

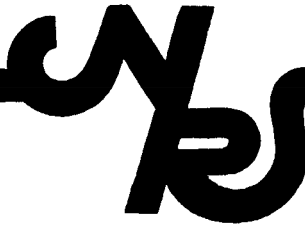
