THE MENTAL HEALTH CENTRE, PESHAWAR, PAKISTAN

DEAR SIR,

I have recently received a request from the Secretary of the Church Missionary Society, 157 Waterloo Road, London SE1 8UU, for the name of any psychiatrist who might be interested in taking up the work which has been initiated in Peshawar, Pakistan, during the past six years by Dr John Bavington. He has created a Mental Health Centre of a highly original kind, adapted to the needs of the local culture and community. Dr Bavington leaves Peshawar in July 1977 and may not be able to resume his work there for family reasons. The Ministry of Overseas Development has recently given a grant for a scheme to train community mental health workers in relation to the work of his Mental Health Centre. I visited the Centre in its early days and was greatly impressed by what Dr Bavington had already accomplished in a short time.

RESEARCH PROPOSALS FOR STUDY OF GENE-ENVIRONMENT INTERACTION IN SCHIZOPHRENIA

DEAR SIR,

The Foundations' Fund for Research in Psychiatry is interested in soliciting research proposals that reflect new, promising, and creative approaches to the study of the interaction of genetic and environmental factors in schizophrenia.

As a step in the process of solicitation, interested investigators are invited to submit preliminary proposals in the form of letters of intent. Such letters, not exceeding five typewritten pages in length, should consist of a description of the projected research proposal, an outline of the procedures to be used, and a statement of the specific manner in which the project will help to clarify the interactional nature of genetic and environmental variables. Approximate cost estimates which can be at rather modest or somewhat larger levels of support should be included.
