## SUMMA OF THE CHRISTIAN LIFE

This work is a synthesis of the spiritual doctrine of Fray Louis of Granada who is recognized as the greatest of all Dominican ascetical writers. It is not a mere collection or anthology, but a carefully arranged grouping of passages selected from the complete works of Granada.

The chapters of the *Summa of the Christian Life* have been arranged in the order of the questions of the *Summa Theologica* of St Thomas Aquinas, so that the present compilation enjoys the greatest theological unity. Moreover, it serves as a practical and inspiring exposition of the theological doctrine of the Angelic Doctor.

The fact that Fray Louis of Granada was above all a theologian for the laity is perhaps nowhere more evident than in the present compilation. Here is a spiritual theology that is within the comprehension of all, for Granada treats of even the most profound truths of the spiritual life with a simplicity and an insight that are characteristic of those souls who have experienced these truths vitally.

The *Summa of the Christian Life* is meant to be a compendium or guide for the formation of the perfect Christian. The theme of this work is the same as that of all the spiritual writings of Fray Louis—that the true Christian lives in and for Christ. To be a genuine Christian it does not suffice to profess the faith passively; it is not enough to believe dogmas; one must also practise the virtues.

This book is the first of the three volumes that comprise the *Summa of the Christian Life* and it treats of the existence and nature of God, the Trinity, creation, and the wonders of the universe. The second volume will treat of the virtues; the third volume, of the life and death of Christ and of the sacraments.

During the war the well-known German Dominican, Franziskus Stratmann, was hunted by the Nazis but succeeded in hiding in a Flemish convent—a convent of the Order of Bethany whose special work is to reclaim, by love and charity, women who because of their sins are branded social outcasts. The Christ-like attitude to those who have strayed inspired Father Stratmann to write this absorbing and moving book, which considers the spiritual implications of the Sisters' work and its lesson for the rest of the world. First published in Flemish and later in German this translation is made by Hilda Graef.
