The Contributors

Edward S. Mason is Professor of Economics and Dean of the Graduate School of Public Administration at Harvard. He has acted as deputy to the Assistant Secretary of State in charge of economic affairs and in 1947 he was chief economic adviser to the American delegation at the Moscow conference.

Percy E. Corbett is Professor of Government and Jurisprudence and Chairman of the Department of Political Science at Yale. He was formerly Dean of the Law School at McGill University. His acquaintance with Soviet political theorists is based not only on a knowledge of their writings, but also on personal contacts resulting from a trip to Russia in 1946.

Arnold Wolfers acted as Director of the Hochschule für Politik in Berlin from 1930 until 1933. He is now Professor of International Relations at Yale and a member of the editorial boards of the *Yale Review* and *World Politics*.

Eric Fischer is Senior Research Geographer at the Virginia Geographical Institute and Visiting Associate Professor at the University of Virginia. His *Passing of the European Age* has recently been republished by the Harvard University Press.

Shannon McCune is Associate Professor and Chairman of the Department of Geography at Colgate. He has written a series of monographs on Korea and has published in numerous geographic journals.

Klaus Knorr is Research Associate in the Yale Institute of International Studies. His works include *British Colonial Theories, 1570-1850* and *Tin Under Control*. He has recently returned from Europe where he surveyed the prospects of a Western Union.

Quincy Wright is Professor of International Law at the University of Chicago and a member of the editorial board of *World Politics*. His best-known work is *A Study of War* which he reviews in this issue.

Jacob J. Kaplan has recently come to the Yale Institute of International Studies from the Department of State where he was Chief of the Division of Economic Research on Southern Europe.

Clyde Kluckhohn is Professor of Anthropology and Director of the Russian Research Center at Harvard. His forthcoming book on *Anthropology and the World Today* has recently been awarded a \$10,000 prize by Whittlesey House and *Science Illustrated*.

Charles Easton Rothwell was executive secretary of the international secretariat at the United Nations Conference on International Organization at San Francisco in 1945. He is now Vice-Chairman of the Hoover Institute and Library at Stanford University.
