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Mayweed chamomile (*Anthemis cotula* L.), a native of Europe, is an annual and has followed man all over the world. It is found throughout the United States and is common in Canada. It is a strong-smelling weed of waste land and cultivated fields. In sensitive people, it produces contact irritations similar to those induced by poison-oak or poison-ivy.
