BRYN MAWR COLLEGE LIBRARY

The Library has recently received the Howard L. Goodhart Collection of Fifteenth Century Books. In addition to MSS and bibliographical aids the Collection includes more than 600 incunabula. In subject matter the emphasis is on those works that constituted the curriculum of the mediaeval universities: arithmetic, geometry, music, astronomy, grammar, logic and rhetoric—and much besides. Concurrently the College's Graduate School has received a Goodhart Fellowship in Mediaeval Studies.

DUKE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Among recent acquisitions, reported in *Library Notes* for April 1952, is a German MS, *Gebete der Passion*, written about 1500, bound by Rivière, containing 23 vellum leaves with 27 miniatures in gold and colors.

HARVARD UNIVERSITY

The University's Isham Library, particularly rich in sources for the study of keyboard music of the Renaissance, is described in the *Harvard Library Bulletin* vi, 3 (Autumn 1952) 376-380 by Archibald T. Davison.

HAVERFORD COLLEGE LIBRARY

A recent bequest is the William Pyle Philips Collection of Renaissance Books. In celebration of the bequest three papers were offered: Archibald MacLeish, 'The Humanities in this Place and Time,' Douglas Bush, 'The Vitality of Renaissance Humanism,' Margaret Webster, 'The Living Shakespeare.'

VATICAN LIBRARY

The microfilming of the MS contents of the Vatican Library, to be deposited in the St. Louis University Library, is moving along, cf. RN iv, 68. L. J. Daly,

S.J., reports that the first shipment of codices has been made and hopes to be able to acquaint the readers of this newsletter with further details in the near future.

A further development in a two-way cultural exchange between the Vatican Library and this country is the presentation of a photostatic copy of the Princeton University Index of Christian Art to the Vatican Library. The Index contains at present 100,000 photographs and 5,000 descriptive cards. It was started in 1917 by Charles R. Morey, and work on it is continuing. The presentation of the photostatic copy was made by Cardinal Spellman of New York, who has also endowed a bibliographical center at the Vatican, involving a union catalogue of twenty-six European libraries, supplementing the Princeton Index.

YALE UNIVERSITY

Sterling Library

Since its report last year (RN iv, 69) Yale has added 85 incunabula including twelve not previously found in the United States. The most significant was *The Dictes and Sayings of the Philosophers*, printed at Westminster by William Caxton late in 1477. Other incunabula were an edition of the *Epistolæ of Phalaris*, printed in Venice in 1498; Cicero's *De finibus honorum et malorum*, printed in Venice not after November 9, 1471; and some fifteenth-century manuscripts written on paper of works by Catullus, Cicero, Herodianus, Ovid, Polybius, Terence, Tibullus, and of eight lives of the saints.

Yale has added 17 Aldine imprints.

The Medical Library has received the library of the late Dr. George Smith, with particular emphasis on early ichthyology. Included are:

Pierre Belon's *L'histoire naturelle des estranges poissons marins*. Paris, 1551, the first printed book devoted to fishes; Konrad von Gesner's *Historia animalium*, 1551-58; Hippolito Salviani's *Aquatilium animalium historiae*, 1554; and Guillaume Rondelet's *De piscibus marinis*, 1554.
