Annual dues for membership in the Association, which includes subscription to PMLA, are \$15 except for the following special categories: a) student membership at \$7, open for a maximum of four years to those who are engaged primarily in a course of study leading to a degree and who do not hold full-time teaching appointments; b) joint husband-and-wife membership at \$22 with only one subscription to PMLA; c) foreign membership at \$10, open to resident citizens of countries other than the United States and Canada.

The subscription price of *PMLA* for libraries and other institutions is \$20 in the United States and Canada and \$18 in other countries. Agents deduct \$2 of these sums as their fee; institutions which subscribe directly may retain the same amount and remit \$18 or \$16. Prior to 1966 there were six issues a year: March, May Bibliography, June, September (Parts 1 and 2), and December. Single copies of the March, June, September (Part 1), and December issues may be obtained for \$3 each; the May Bibliography and September Directory (Part 2) issues for \$4. Reginning with 1966 there are seven issues a year: March, May, June Bibliography, September Directory, October, November Program, and December issues may be obtained for \$3 each; the June Bibliography and September Directory issues for \$4. Issues for the current and preceding year are available from the MLA Materials Center. Claims for undelivered issues will be honored if they are received within one year of the publication date; thereafter the single issue price will be charged.

Early and current volumes may be obtained on microfilm from University Microfilms, 313 N. 1st St., Ann Arbor, Mich. Purchase of current volumes on film is restricted to subscribers of the journal.

A STATEMENT OF EDITORIAL POLICY

PMLA endeavors to represent the most distinguished contemporary scholarship and criticism in the modern languages and literatures. It welcomes either new or traditional approaches by either young or established scholars, providing only that whatever it publishes is well written and likely to be of permanent value. The distribution of papers in PMLA should reflect work of distinction actually being done from year to year, regardless of periods or languages. Members who feel their interests neglected by this policy are urged to write and to encourage others to write articles good enough to be published.

Since its audience is the total membership of the Association, PMLA is reluctant to publish minor articles or highly technical studies addressed to specialists in limited fields. Nor does it encourage brief notes or unduly long papers. PMLA does not review books. Articles should be written in a clear, concise, and attractive style, with documentation

held to a necessary minimum.

Any member of the Association has the privilege of submitting papers for publication in *PMLA*. Each paper submitted will be read by at least one consultant with special competence in the field concerned and, if in any way recommended, it will also be read by at least one member of the Editorial Committee. Attempt is made to publish papers within nine months of acceptance. If a decision to accept or reject a paper seems unduly delayed, contributors are reminded that the consultant readers and the Editorial Committee are distinguished men and women who generously contribute their scant leisure to the advancement of scholarship in humane letters.

Manuscripts must be prepared in conformity with the MLA Style Sheet, published in the April 1951 PMLA and on sale as a pamphlet in the MLA offices. Authors are urged to read also the advice of R. B. McKerrow and H. M. Silver on scholarly publication, published in the April 1950 PMLA, and "The Publication of Academic Writing," by Oscar Cargill, William Charvat, and Donald D. Walsh, in the Sept. 1966 PMLA, both also on sale as pamphlets. Manuscripts should be addressed to the Editor of PMLA, 62 Fifth Avenue, New York, N. Y. 10011. Carbon copies are not needed, but should be made and retained by the author.

RECOMMENDATIONS CONCERNING THE PH.D. IN ENGLISH

URING 1966-67, the Modern Language Association, with financial assistance from the Danforth Foundation, sponsored a study of the Ph.D. in English in American universities. The Director of the Study was Don Cameron Allen, Sir William Osler Professor of English of the Johns Hopkins University. Throughout the Study, Professor Allen worked with an Advisory Committee composed of Theodore Andersson (Chairman and Professor of Romance Languages. University of Texas), Gustave Arlt (President, Council of Graduate Schools in the United States), Fredson Bowers (Chairman and Professor of English, University of Virginia), John C. Gerber (Chairman and Professor of English. University of Iowa), Albert R. Kitzhaber (Professor of English, University of Oregon), Maynard Mack (Chairman and Professor of English, Yale University), Robert Ornstein (Chairman and Professor of English, Western Reserve University), Gordon N. Ray (President, John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation). The Director and Committee met with representatives of almost all departments now offering the Ph.D. in English. Questionnaires were mailed to all of those who received the Ph.D. in English between 1955 and 1965, chairmen of all departments offering the Ph.D. in English, graduate professors of English, and chairmen of a representative sample of English departments not offering the Ph.D. Mr. Allen's full report will be published by Holt, Rinehart, and Winston in the spring of 1968.

The following recommendations are unanimously concurred in by the members of the Advisory Committee on the Ph.D. Study. They are based upon the extensive documentation in the full report. The Committee respectfully submits these recommendations to departments now offering the Ph.D. in English and to those preparing to do so.

I. English Departments, in addition to pursuing their objectives of liberal education for all undergraduate students, should concern themselves with the early identification and career advising of potential college teachers.

Not all English majors intend to be teachers, certainly not college teachers, but those who do deserve special attention during their undergraduate years. II. The Ph.D. program in English should be undertaken only where there are adequate faculty, library resources, and study facilities.

A department might decide to offer the Ph.D. only in some areas; at the end of the M.A. it might arrange the transfer of some students to departments which offered the Ph.D. in the area of their interest. Departments contemplating the introduction of a Ph.D. program should secure competent outside advice.

III. Ph.D. study should be full time study.

Part time study after the M.A. should be discouraged as inefficient and ineffective. Financial support for Ph.D. students should be provided by the institution, by private foundations, by state and national government, and by the student himself. Supervised teaching (IX below) should be worked in as a regular part of the program.

IV. The Ph.D. in English should require no more than four years of full time study following the B.A.

Institutions should make it possible for students to remain at the university and devote themselves to full time study during the summer months.

v. A decision regarding the student's acceptability for doctoral study should be made by the Department by the time the M.A. is awarded.

In the case of transfer students, the decision should be made by the end of the first academic year of residence at the new institution.

vi. A knowledge of one foreign language and its literature at the fourth year college level should be an alternative to the two or three language requirement.

This recommendation must be recognized as calling, in fact, for a substantial increase in view of the frequent laxity of application of the current language

requirements. The foreign language requirement need not necessarily be confined to French or German.

- VII. After the M.A., most of the Ph.D. student's courses should be seminars and other small classes.
- VIII. The Ph.D. student should study language as well as literature.

In this context the study of language means study of the nature of language, the history and structure of English, and the principles of rhetoric.

IX. The Ph.D. student should do a limited amount of supervised teaching as part of his program.

By limited amount is meant no more than one class per term in the second and third years of the program. The teaching should be supervised and should require attention to both composition and literature. Departments should regard teaching as part of the student's education, not as a means of staffing courses.

- x. The major doctoral examination should be of reasonable length and need not cover all of English and American literature.
- XI. The dissertation should be of such scope that it can be completed within twelve

months of full time work. Achieving this end is the responsibility of the supervisor as well as of the candidate.

The student should be able to complete both research and writing in twelve months. He should, however, be encouraged to choose a dissertation subject early, and by the beginning of the fourth year should have completed all other work in the Ph.D. program. The supervisor should cooperate with the student by reading his work promptly and by taking steps to see that he is not delayed if the supervisor has to be away from the university.

- XII. The dissertation may be either a monograph or a group of related essays.
- XIII. The examination after the dissertation should be abolished.
- xiv. An interim degree should be awarded to a student who has completed all requirements except the dissertation.

At the present the Ph.C. (Candidate in Philosophy) and M. Phil. (Master of Philosophy) are being introduced.

xv. The profession should explore the feasibility of systematic post-doctoral work in English.

DISTRIBUTION OF MLA MEMBERS

Worth noting, as MLA has more than doubled in membership over the last seven years, the percentage of membership in the Northeast has risen (36.1% to 38.3%); membership in New York state alone has risen from 14.9% to 19.9%. We are gratified by this evidence of popularity on home ground, but we remind members from other parts of the country that if this trend persists they really have no complaint about a preponderance of Northeastern members on MLA committees. Indeed, a careful count would show that other parts of the country are probably overrepresented on a straight per capita count. It is interesting to observe, for example, that the ratio of MLA members to

total college enrollment in New York is .94 and in Connecticut .86, whereas in California it is .27 and in Utah .14. The sense of exclusion from the intellectual life of the Association sometimes expressed by the South and West may be both the cause and the effect of their relatively lighter participation. As a step towards correcting the balance, the Executive Council last April voted that beginning in 1975 (the earliest date when hotel accommodations can be secured), the MLA will begin a triennial rotation of the Annual Meeting, to the East, the Middle West, and the West Coast. One bright note in the statistics: Canadian membership has increased from 2% to 3.37%.
