In Professor G. C. Field's review of my *Companion to the Pre-Socratic Philosophers*, he suggests as a minor criticism that it might have been possible to give rather more in the way of *verbatim* translation of some of the fragments, and adds:

"The actual words are always more impressive than a paraphrase, however accurate."

With this view I entirely agree; and it is in order to supply those who do not read Greek with this necessary concomitant that I have published also an *Ancilla to the Pre-Socratic Philosophers*, which is a complete translation of all the fragments in Diels.

INTERNATIONAL INSTITUTE OF PHILOSOPHY

Since publishing the preliminary notice in the January issue of *PHILOSOPHY*, the following further information has been received about the nature of the new post-war editions of the *INTERNATIONAL PHILOSOPHICAL BIBLIOGRAPHY*.

The Bibliography (recently recommended by U.N.E.S.C.O.), appears in two volumes annually of about 350 pages each, and titles have been listed since 1947 in both English and French. It contains six sections as follows:—

- (1) World catalogue of philosophy *publishers*, classified by country.
- (2) Catalogue of philosophical and semi-philosophical *journals*, also classified by country.
- (3) Catalogue of all philosophical work produced during the past six months, with all necessary details for libraries, etc., classified in alphabetical order of *authors* (including all journal articles).
- (4) *Topographical and chronological* catalogue of the entire matter of the volume.
- (5) List of *philosophers and thinkers*, drawn up and analysed from the works and articles mentioned in catalogue 3.
- (6) An Anglo-French analytical philosophical lexicon of the entire matter of the volume, classified by *ideas*.

Postal charges (registered) for two volumes annually, additional: 75 cents.

Group subscriptions for members of societies are not only permitted but recommended. Back numbers of the bibliography may be obtained.
