This Bulletin deals with the complex topic of land tenure, regulation by the state and the relationship to sustainable land use. Includes an interesting case study from Cameroon, where economic trends plus modern legislation led to the collapse of traditional protection, resulting in an uncontrollable situation in the forest; plus articles covering the need to harmonize traditional and modern laws, and the attempts to do this in Mali since 1991.

In large parts of Africa, agriculture is subject to considerable pressure due to increasing exploitation of soils that are less suitable for cultivation and more susceptible to erosion. Expansion leads to a shortening of the fallow period required that once served to restore soil fertility.

Here literature and experience are brought together in an economic analysis, including a cost-benefit analysis of improved fallow and a cost-benefit comparison of natural and improved fallow.
