In Memoriam

The Editors sorrowfully report that Paul Seligman, Professor Emeritus of the University of Waterloo, died on March 2, 1985 after a lengthy illness. Professor Seligman was born in Bingen, Germany, in 1903. In the late 1920s, he was active in the cultural life in Frankfurt as an author and film maker, left Germany in 1936 and began the study of philosophy at the University of London in the 1940s. He received his Ph.D. degree in 1956, and he taught at the University of Waterloo from 1963 to 1975, when he retired as Professor. In 1975, he received a distinguished teaching award from the Ontario Faculty Associations, and, at the time of his death, was the Honorary President of the C. G. Jung Foundation in Toronto. His publications include numerous articles and two books: *The Apeiron of Anaximander* and *Being and Not-Being: An Introduction to Plato's Sophist*.

Professor Seligman was a frequent contributor and referee for *Dialogue*.
