

## CORRIGENDUM

Subsequent to publication of his article “The velar stops and fricatives in the languages of MSS A, B, C of the *Nibelungenlied*” (*AJGLL* 1,1:1989, 67-87), William G. Moulton has provided the following to substitute for the final paragraph and table on p. 78 (bottom).

Parallel to the shift of \*/-kk-/ to /-kkx-/ was that of \*/-nk-, -lk-, -rk-/ to /-nkx-, -lkx-, -rkx-/, as in the following sample words: /dánkxən/ ‘danken’, /vólkxəs/ ‘(des) Volkes’, /stárkxən/ ‘starken (inflected)’. Scribal spellings:
