

The objects of the Society are the furtherance of Classical studies in general, and in particular the discussion and publication of critical research into the languages, literature and civilisation of ancient Greece and Rome. It meets to hear academic papers around eight times each year, and publishes *The Cambridge Classical Journal* (formerly *Proceedings of the Cambridge Philological Society*) and *Supplements to CCJ*.

Anyone interested in the ancient world is eligible for membership. Annual subscription for individuals costs £14/\$28 (including online access to CCJ and its archive) or £20/\$38 (online access and hard copy).
