Oryx Tours 1979

Ecuador and the Galapagos, August12-September 1: Eleven days in Ecuador, including excursions on the Napo river and Taracoa lake in Amazonia, followed by a week sailing in the Galapagos islands. The leader is Dr James Juvik, FPS Consultant in Hawaii.

Zambia and Southern Tanzania, August 14-September 3: Six days at Norman Carr's Chibembe Camp, overlooking South Luangwa National Park in Zambia, two days at Kafue National Park, and nine days in Tanzania, with extended stays in the Selous Game Reserve and Mikumi National Park.
