## **NOMINATIONS FOR 1973-74**

The Nominating Committee (Immanuel Wallerstein, Chairman, Rupert Emerson and Sharon Stichter; absent Christian Potholm and Stanlake Samkange) met on 18 December 1972. The following people have accepted the invitation of the Committee to stand for election to the Vice Presidency and the Board of Directors.

Article II, Section 9 of the Association By-laws provides that "At least sixty (60) days prior to the date of (the) annual meeting, any ten or more Members may nominate additional candidates by sending their nominations to the Elections Committee."

The final date for receiving additional nominations will be June 1, 1973. Nominations should be sent to the Executive Secretary, 218 Shiffman Center, Brandeis University, Waltham, Massachusetts 02154, and must be accompanied by a signed statement from the nominee that she/he is willing to stand for election and that she/he will serve if elected. Sponsors of nominations must presently be members of the Association.

The June issue of the <u>Newsletter</u> will print statements by the candidates. Ballots will be sent to members in July.
