

# Notes on Contributors

## Gilbert Ryle (1900–76)

Taught at Christ Church, Oxford from 1924–45 and was Waynflete Professor of Metaphysics at Oxford University from 1945–68. His *Concept of Mind* (1949) is one of the classics of twentieth century philosophy.

## Jennifer Nagel

Teaches philosophy at the University of New Mexico and the University of Toronto.

## Philip Kitcher

Professor of Philosophy at Columbia University. He has written books and articles on a variety of topics in the philosophy of science.

## Achille Varzi

Associate Professor of Philosophy at Columbia University. His most recent works are *An Essay in Universal Semantics* and *Parts and Places* (with Roberto Casati).

## Neil Cooper

Emeritus Professor of Philosophy, University of Dundee. He is author of *The Diversity of Moral Thinking*. His contributions to *Philosophy* include 'Two Concepts of Morality' (January 1996) and 'The Art of Philosophy' (April 1991).

## Stephen R. L. Clark

Professor of Philosophy, University of Liverpool. His most recent book is *Biology and Christian Ethics* (forthcoming, Cambridge University Press).

## D. Goldstick

Professor of Philosophy, University of Toronto. His earlier contributions to *Philosophy* include 'The Welfare of the Dead' (January 1988).

## Colin Radford

Formerly Research Professor of Philosophy, University of Kent. Now Emeritus (since 1996).

## Phil Dowe

Lecturer in Philosophy at the University of Tasmania. He works on causation, time and chance. He has published a book on causation, *Physical Causation* (Cambridge University Press, 2000) and is currently working on a book on time travel called 'Backwards Causation'.
