The first deals with the evidence provided by the human remains recently found at Broken Hill, and the comparison of these with other traces of early man, and in the attempt to answer the question as to who produced the splendid range of stone implements, the full description and discussion of which occupies the second part of the book. The final section deals with cave-paintings and sculptures, specimens of the early art of the Bushmen.
