Contributions within the scope covered by the journal (see inside front cover) are invited and should be submitted via the *Antichthon* ScholarOne site at: <https://mc.manuscriptcentral.com/antichthon>

Greek or other non-Roman script should be submitted in a unicode font. Normally contributions should be between 5,000 and 10,000 words in length (inclusive of footnotes and bibliography), though shorter articles will be considered. Articles should be accompanied by an abstract of between 150 and 200 words.

Articles are routinely sent to two or more referees for peer review.

Antichthon is part of the Cambridge Core Share initiative that allows authors and subscribers to generate a URL link that can be publicly shared, including on social sharing sites.
