Another 1,000 will follow by the end of 2009 and 3,000 titles a year will be added as the program continues.

Drawing from the world-renowned collections in the Cambridge University Library, these books are carefully selected by experts in each subject area because of their scholarly importance or as landmarks in the history of their academic discipline.

Cambridge University Press is using state-of-the art scanning machines to capture the contents of each book. The files are processed to give a consistently clear, crisp image, and the books finished to the high-quality standard for which the press is recognized around the world. The latest print-ondemand technology ensures that the books will remain available indefinitely.

The Cambridge Library Collection will revive books of enduring scholarly value across a wide range of disciplines in the humanities, social sciences, science and technology.
